

**From the sheep yards**



**LAMBS**

Lambs sold to \$151 for 22 lambs sold by Landmark on account B & S Coleman. Other highlights included 68 lambs sold by Davidson Cameron McCulloch (DCM) on account BJ & JM Walters and suckers sold by DCM on account WJ Cameron & Sons for \$145. 3630 lambs were sold and averaged \$135. 154 suckers sold to \$145 and averaged \$135 and shorn lambs sold to \$143 with 807 sold for an average price of \$128.



**SHEEP**

Highlight in the sheep was a run of 335 wethers sold by Chris Paterson for Peter Musgrave, “Penmore” Wallabadah with the top pen making \$120. Peter says that he was extremely pleased with the price, adding “I had to get \$100 - so \$120 was unreal.” They had 11 months of wool and cut 5kg this year and 3.9kg last year during the drought. Despite the price it was a regretful sale for Peter.

“I didn’t want to put them on the truck

this morning but I’ve decided to go out of sheep on “Penmore”, because of 4 or 5 factors, including the workload and wild dog problems,” he said. He’ll continue to run sheep on an additional property.

Ewes sold to \$120 and averaged \$68 with 600 sold; wethers sold to \$120 with 555 sold and averaging \$100. Rams sold to \$72 and averaged \$52 with 39 sold.
